## TREARDDUR COMMUNITY COUNCIL **BIODIVERSITY PLAN 2022-2025** 1. Introduction: The Environment (Wales) Act 2016 introduced the Biodiversity Resilience and Ecosystems Duty requiring public authorities to maintain and enhance biodiversity and, in doing so, promote the resilience of ecosystems, thereby embedding biodiversity in its day-to-day decision making, plans and policies. 2. Our aim: The aim of the Plan is to ensure the Community Council maintains and enhances the area's varied and notable biodiversity in the exercise of its statutory duties and discretionary activities and, in so doing, promote the resilience of ecosystems. 3. **Key objectives:** ensuring the impacts and opportunities associated with biodiversity are an integral part of the Council's decision's making process. safeguard species and habitats of principal importance increase the resilience of our natural environment by habitat creation: tackle key pressures on species and habitats; increase awareness, understanding and appreciation of biodiversity; 4. Our area: Much of the Trearddur Community Council area, which encompasses the village of Trearddur Bay, Porthdafarch, the Range, part of Mynydd Twr and South Stack is within the AONB. We have diverse habitats of sand dunes, salt marshes, heathland farm land and a few wooded areas. The RSPB and the Wild Life Trust manage large areas and the Ynys Cybi Landscape Partnership are active here but the Community Council has very few areas of ground that it can directly manage and control. Our emphasis must therefore be on improving existing wildlife interest at these sites and considering this in relation to the wildlife that is in the surrounding areas.
